

You should take a minute to go through the itinerary before you start your Daytrip. It's pretty easy to navigate a Daytrip alone but it's always helpful to have a companion, especially if it's your first time out. You'll find that there is probably more information than you will need concerning directions, landmarks, and comments.

If you follow the itinerary you'll never get lost (though some times it might feel that way), but it's a good idea to have a service station type roadmap with you. Any true backroad that you may be on will generally wind up at a main State Route or U.S. Highway at some point.

Distances between points are to the tenth of a mile. This is more about precision and accuracy than wanting you to constantly watch the odometer. While some directions require you to pay attention to a turn, most happen at a deadend and/or well described landmark. RELAX AND ENJOY THE DRIVE.

The most important parts of the itinerary are highlighted. Have a pen with you so you can check off the itinerary along the way. We expect that you'll find a "Daytrip Favorite" that you'll want to take more than once. In our experience, we hardly glanced at the itinerary on a repeat Daytrip. Once you're out there on the road, it will be that obvious.

**Road Rating:**

- L1. Level 1 – Best**  
4 lane highway, watch for cross traffic.
- L2. Level 2 – Good**  
Well marked and maintained 2 lane road.
- L3. Level 3 – Difficult**  
1 ½- 2 lanes, may be unlined. Blind or sharp curves and hills.  
Watch for slow moving farm machinery, Amish buggies, bikes, etc.!
- L4. Level 4 – Most Difficult**  
1 ½ lanes, unlined. May be gravel on asphalt in some places.  
Blind or sharp curves and hills. Not much traffic, but no margin for error either. Please drive carefully.

**NOTE:** Whenever you go through any town the speed limit will drop down to 35mph, and in many cases 25mph. Always obey the posted speed limit.

## **OHIO ANTIQUES & ARTS**

Looking for a different kind of gift for that special someone (it's OK if YOU are that special someone)? Maybe a one-of-a-kind addition to your home? Perhaps you're in search of that one item to complete your collection of, well, whatever it is that you collect.

Here in the city we're stuck with a lot of chain stores, and it can be hard to find a truly unique item, something that speaks to you. Something of substance.

You're in luck! This Daytrip is for you. You'll follow the road less traveled to the Ohio towns of Wilmington, Waynesville, and Lebanon. Here you'll find more than 90 Antiques, Arts, & Collectibles shops. And of course, the friendly and knowledgeable folks you'll meet in these shops.

For an item to be considered officially an antique, it must be over 100 years old. Collectibles (which can be about anything) are not necessarily antiques but can be just as valuable. A good rule to follow is not to get hung up on definitions; Antiquing & Collecting is a very personal thing, and if an item is perfect for you then that's what is most important.

There are some really great country roads on this Daytrip. We think that you'll find Guerneville and Lower Springboro Roads to be especially enjoyable.

**Drivetime for this Daytrip is 3 ½ hours. Drivetime begins and ends at I-275. Depending on the day and time, especially weekday afternoon rush hour, the area south of Paramount Kings Island/I-71 of this Daytrip may be a bit congested. This could add about 20 minutes of drivetime.**

**FIRST LEG**

- L1. From I-275 get onto I-71 North (Exit 49B Columbus).  
Go 7.8 miles to the 3<sup>rd</sup> exit (Exit 25 State Route 741 North/Kings Mill Road/ Mason). Exit 25 is at the North end of Paramount Kings Island.  
Turn right at the traffic light.**
- L1. Turn left at the 2<sup>nd</sup> traffic light (Columbia Road).**
- L2. Go 2.8 miles to the stopsign at Main Street, in South Lebanon, Ohio.  
Turn right.**  
Landmark: 2.3 miles in, you'll come to a traffic light. Keep going straight.
- L2. Go about 100 yards, crossing over a creek, and turn left on Broadway.**
- L2. Go to a deadend, at the 3<sup>rd</sup> stopsign. Turn left, then an immediate right on Morrow Road.** Landmark: At the 3<sup>rd</sup> stopsign, you'll see the Family Food Mart, on the left. After you turn right on Morrow Road you'll come to a stopsign. The road changes name to Mason-Morrow-Millgrove Road. Keep going straight.
- L3. Go 2 miles to a deadend at the stopsign at Stubbs Mills Road  
Turn left, then an immediate right to remain on Mason-Morrow-Millgrove Road.**
- L3. Go another 7.6 miles to a sharp right turn onto Strout Road. Note: There is no stopsign or traffic light (There is a sign for Strout Road).**  
Landmark: 4.8 miles in you'll come to a stopsign at State Route 123. Keep going straight. The Little Miami River & Morrow, Ohio will be on your right.
- L4. Go 3.3 miles to the stopsign at US Highway 22/State Route 3.  
Turn left.** Landmark: 1.7 miles in you'll come to a stopsign. **Use Caution: Cross Traffic Does Not Stop.** Keep going straight.
- L2. Go 1.6 miles and bear right at the fork that takes you to State Route 350.  
About a mile further, at State Route 350, bear right .** This is well marked.
- L2. Go 2.2 miles to the traffic light in Clarksville, Ohio.  
Turn left .** Landmark: On the right corner, you'll see the Corner Market/Citgo Gas.
- L2. Go 2.7 miles to Pyle Road, on the right. Turn right.  
Note: There is no stopsign or traffic light, so pay close attention on this one (There is a street sign for Pyle Road).**
- L3. Go 1.6 miles to a deadend at the stopsign, at Halpin Road.  
Turn left.**

**L2. Go 2 miles to a deadend at the stopsign, at the junction with State Route 730. Turn left. Note: At one point, Halpin Road changes name to Ogden Road. Also, there is no road sign visible at the junction with State Route 730, but this is it.**  
Landmark: 1 mile in you'll come to a stopsign. Keep going straight.

**L2. Go 4.4 miles to the junction with US Highway 68/State Route 134. Turn left. This will take you into the center of Wilmington, Ohio. On your right you'll see a large, domed courthouse. Find a place to park.**  
A great first stop is the Clinton County Convention & Visitors Bureau. This is in the old bank building at the corner of Main & South Streets, at the northwest corner of the courthouse.  
Landmarks along the way on Us Highway 68/State Route 134:  
1.4 miles in: Church on the right.  
3 miles in: Stopsign with 2 flashing red lights. Go straight.  
3.8 miles in: Cemetery on the left.  
4.3 miles in: Stopsign. Go straight.

### **SECOND LEG**

**L2. Continue straight/North on the road that you came in on. .5 miles in US Highway 68 forks to the left.**  
**Bear left to remain on US Highway 68.** State Route 134 forks to the right. This is well marked.

**L2. Go 4 miles to Guernyville Road. Turn left.**  
**Note: There is no stopsign or traffic light, so pay close attention. (There is a street sign for Guernyville Road).** Landmark: There is a tall broadcast tower on the far left corner.

**L2. Go 7.2 miles to a deadend at the stopsign, at New Burlington Road. Turn left.** Landmark: There is a farmhouse and red barn across the street.  
Landmark along the way: 1.2 miles in, you'll pass by the Clinton County Airport, on the left. Just past that, you'll cross over I-71.

**L2. Go 1.4 miles to a deadend at the stopsign, at the junction with State Route 380. Turn right.**

**L2. Go 5.3 miles to West Krepps Road. Turn left. Note: There is no stopsign or traffic light (There is a street sign for West Krepps Road).**

- L3. Go 1.5 miles to a deadend at the stopsign, at US Highway 42.  
Turn left.**
- L1, with some L2. Go 4.8 miles to Old Stage Road.  
Turn right. Note: There is no stopsign or traffic light. (There is a street sign for Old Stage Road). There are no real Landmarks, just trees all around.**
- L3. Go 5.5 to the stopsign at North Street, in Waynesville, Ohio.  
Turn left.**

Landmarks along the way on Old Stage Road:  
1.8 miles in: 4-way stopsign. Go straight.  
4.4 miles in: 3-way stopsign. Go straight. Just past this you'll see a sign that you're entering Waynesville, Ohio.  
5.2 miles in: Stopsign. Go straight. North Street is the next stopsign.
- L2. Go to the traffic light at the bottom of the hill. This is Main Street.  
Find a place to park.** Stop in at the Waynesville area Chamber of Commerce for complete information on what to see and do in Waynesville. It's at the corner of North and Main Street in the same building as The Cobblestone Village Cafe.

### **THIRD LEG**

- L2. Exit Waynesville by going South on Main Street, until you come to a stopsign.  
Turn left.** Landmark: There is a BP service station across the street and the Dairy Corner Restaurant on the left corner.  
**Go 100 feet to the traffic light at US Highway 42.  
Turn right.**
- L1. Go .8 miles to Lower Springboro Road. Turn right. After you turn onto Lower Springboro Road you'll make a quick left, then a quick right to remain on Lower Springboro Road.  
Note: There is no stopsign or traffic light. (There is a street sign for Lower Springboro Road).**
- L2. Go 2.4 miles to a deadend at the stopsign.  
Turn right.** Landmark: Farmhouse across the street.
- L2. Go about 100 yards and turn left to remain on Lower Springboro Road.**

**L2. Go 2.4 miles to a stopsign and 2 flashing red lights, at the junction with State Route 48.  
Turn left.**

**L2. Go 6 miles into Lebanon, Ohio.  
Once you get into downtown, find a place to park.** Visit the Lebanon Chamber of Commerce to learn about all of the cool stuff in Lebanon. It's right on State Route 48 (North Broadway in town), 2 doors down from the bank. Look for the white sign.

### **HOME STRETCH**

**L2. Exit Lebanon, Ohio by following the signs for State Route 48.  
In 4.3 miles you'll come to I-71.**

**L2. Go 11 miles to I-275. From the time that you leave Lebanon, it will take about 30 minutes to get to I-275.**
